Rasmus Reinvang holds the Mag. Art. degree (equiv. to PhD) in Cultural Studies from the University of Oslo and has more than 12 years experience working with policy and sector analysis, CSR, strategy and foresight, as well as international development projects. Rasmus has extensive capacity building experience and evaluation experience, and has also worked with campaigns and advocacy.

Thematically, Rasmus has especially worked with nature conservation, ecosystem services, renewable energy, climate, sustainability, development aid, urbanization, religion and politics, Indian and Asian culture and history, as well as Scandinavian, EU and multilateral policy. He has been responsible for implementation of 10 international development projects in Eastern Europe and Asia funded by the Norwegian government with a total budget of NOK 88 mill.
